THE RULES

1. Exhibitors must live in The Lee Parish, Ballinger, Potter Row or South Heath or have a child at Lee Common School. Children showing must either live in this area, or attend Lee Common School, or be a Ballinger Rainbow or Brownie or a member of Lee Common Scout Group.
2. An exhibitor may enter more than one exhibit in a class, but only one prize will be awarded.
3. In Division 1 produce is judged on quality, except for floral art classes, and must have been grown by the exhibitor.
4. In the classes 1 and 19 collections the same number of each kind must be shown as in separate classes e.g. onions 4, potatoes 4, beetroot 3, peas 7. Judged according to RHS points.
5. The Judge's decision is final.
6. Exhibits must be staged between 8.30 am - 10.30 am – ready for the judging to commence promptly.
7. Only officials of the Show are allowed in the marquee during judging.
8. A vase is a vessel for displaying cut flowers in water having a greater height than the width of its mouth. An annual is grown from seed this year.
9. Pot plants must be in the exhibitor's possession for a minimum of two months. Last date of purchase 19 May 2008.
10. In Division 3 please state on a label attached whether your own original design, a copy, or made from a kit.
11. Exhibitors' cards must be fixed to exhibits in classes 81-91.
12. Entries brought to the show after the judging has begun will be staged by the stewards at their discretion.

ENTRY FORMS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE ENTRIES SECRETARY NOT LATER THAN THE THURSDAY BEFORE THE SHOW

PRIZE MONEY will be paid out by the Treasurer between 4.00 pm and 5.00 pm. Prize money not claimed from the Treasurer in two days will be donated to Lee Common School Book Fund.

Please name variety of vegetables, fruit and pot plants if known.

The Show Committee cannot accept responsibility for exhibits left in the marquee after 5.30 pm when the dance set up will begin.

DATE LOAF RECIPE

Class 71

Ingredients

225g (8oz) dates
75g (3oz) sultanas
50g (2oz) butter
150g (5oz) sugar
225g (8oz) self raising flour
1 egg
1 level tsp. Bicarbonate of soda
1 cup of boiling water

Oven temperature: 150C/300F/gas mark 2

900g (2lb) loaf tin

Method

Chop dates, put with sultanas, butter and sugar in a bowl

Pour on boiling water, stir to melt butter and sugar and leave to cool

Pour into flour and bicarbonate of soda

Add egg and mix well

Bake in loaf tin for approximately one and a half hours at 150C/300F/gas mark 2

Cool for 20minutes in the tin then turn out

Best eaten buttered
